1. What does receiving an eConsult mean?

Your primary care clinician will connect with a top national specialist to review your case.

The specialist will offer insights and guidance to your primary care clinician so they can develop the best care plan for you.

2. Who are the specialists reviewing my eConsult?

The specialists are experienced US-based physicians who are dedicated to sharing their clinical knowledge and improving access to specialty expertise.

3. What do I do after my clinician submits an eConsult?

Your primary care clinician will receive a response from a specialist typically within one business day.

As a result, your clinician will decide on the best care for you, which may or may not require a referral, additional testing or procedure.
